

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR VOCATIONAL OR TECHNICAL SCHOOLS:

FEDERAL PELL GRANT

The Federal Pell Grant (PELL) is a federally funded grant program which provides aid to post-secondary students who are seeking a diploma or certificate in an eligible program at our institution. Pell grants are restricted to students who have not earned a bachelor's degree or beyond.

OKLAHOMA TUITION AID GRANT (OTAG)

The Oklahoma Tuition Aid Grant Program (OTAG) is a need-based grant program for Oklahoma residents who attend approved colleges, universities, and career technology centers in Oklahoma. OTAG is a program of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. Awards are approved for full-time or part-time undergraduate study.

FEDERAL SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANT (FSEOG)

FSEOG is a federally funded grant program given to the students with the greatest need.

FEDERAL WORK STUDY

Federal Work Study is a federally funded program which provides part-time work to eligible post-secondary students enrolled at least half-time.

SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP (13TH YEAR) TUITION FEE WAIVER

Check with the school that you want to attend – school district may have to be part of the vocational system.

OTHA GRIMES/FRANCIS TUTTLE SCHOLARSHIP

The Oklahoma Vocational Technical Foundation was formed in 1970 for the purpose of administering scholarships to deserving students who have not received any other assistance. Check with the school you want to attend.

VETERANS ADMINISTRATION

If you are a veteran of war you may be eligible for financial assistance. Contact your veteran administration office. Call 1-888-GI-BILL-1 (1-888-442-4551) to speak with a Veterans Benefits Counselor.

OSAGE TRIBAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE SCHOLARSHIP (OTEC)

This scholarship is intended to help Native American college/university and technical school students of any age, any tribe, in any state at the undergraduate or graduate level. Graduate students are eligible; however, undergraduate students are given preference.

Applicants must be Native Americans (proof of American Indian blood is required by letter or proof papers) in financial need and have a grade point average of 2.75 or higher. There will be no exceptions.

This is a one time \$500 award.

Deadlines: For Fall term, April 1; For Spring term, October 1.
