

From Kansas to Home, a Cultural Experience



Our Mission: To bring insight and knowledge to our Osage people as we are descendents and survivors of a great nation of people. To experience, on a very basic level, our history and culture through modern eyes; to encourage historic learning and cultural activity.

Over the generations our people walked from the Ohio basin to what is now the Osage reservation. We want to experience a small symbolic taste of what that might have been like for them. We will not have the hardship they experienced, but we will have the pilgrimage in our hearts.

Our hope is to bring you a happy family event; you are encouraged to bring your children, your parents and all your relations. This will be only a first in a series of events that will lead up to discovering the entire journey from eastern Kansas to home. ***Please join us!***

Registration

Registration opens: August 15, 2010 and closes September 15, 2010. Members and their families of the Osage Nation are invited to participate in a cultural walk on Saturday, October 23, ending Sunday, October 24, 2010.

Eligibility:

You **must** be Osage. Your application will be verified through our Membership department. If you do not have a membership number, your CDIB will work and once again, verified through CDIB.

Non-Osage parents, spouses, significant others will be allowed so long as you are registered with an Osage member.

Children 17 and under must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

You **must** agree to participate in a group and be responsible for completing the group assignment.

You **must** agree to complete the orientation and training the morning before the journey begins.

Absolutely, **no** alcohol will be allowed on this travel.

Registration Fees:

There will be a \$20 charge for each adult traveling. Children 17 and under are free. For your registration fee you will receive for **each** traveler, including non-paying children:

- An over the shoulder pack
- A water container
- A flashlight
- 1 set of dishes for each individual. Plate, bowl, utensils and a water container.

Items you should bring: Remember you have to carry them to the camp site. So, pack to share the load and keep it simple.

Tent – which you can set up yourself

Walking shoes – don't buy them at the last minute. Make sure they are broken in.

Sleeping Bags and blankets

Clothes for warmth

Toiletries – keep to a minimum, we are only going to be gone overnight.

Porta johns will be provided.

Rain gear – our trip will go on rain or shine.

Cell phones must be turned off during event. They can be used for emergencies only.

Flash lights – one small key ring flashlight will be provided to each traveler, but if you would like to bring something else, as long as it is portable and not attached to a generator.

You cannot bring:

Ice Chests – we will be providing food and water for the trip.

Groups: Each adult traveler will be assigned to a group.

Logistics:

Trail: Members of this group will be assigned to guide, assist and keep our travelers safe as we transport. Such as physical needs, assisting with travelers crossing a rocky area and securing that all in their assigned group are accounted for.

Transport: Members of this group will be assigned to seeing that all travelers are safely loaded and transported to the final area.

Safety: Members of this group will be assigned to seeing that all travelers are moving safely across the trail. If there are needs such as, sprained ankles, becoming overly exerted, unable to keep up. Working with trail workers, see to the medical attention of the travelers.

Once we arrive at our destination, this group will also be responsible for the safety of the camp for security and fire prevention.

Storage: Members of this group will see to the needs of our supplies. Once we arrive at our final destination, storage set up and protection from invasion.

Operations:

Fire & Wood: Members of this group will be responsible for lighting and keeping the fires going all night. This is a highly responsible job. We will be lighting fires with flint and then it will be the responsibility of these members to secure that we have fire all night and in the morning. These members are also responsible for working with fire prevention.

Food: Members of this group will be responsible for seeing that dinner, snacks and breakfast are provided. The food storages will be managed by the Storage group, but the cooks group will be responsible for preparing all meals. Each member is responsible for their personal clean up. Cooks will be responsible for meal clean up.

Water: Members of this group will be responsible for water storage. Everyone will be given a water container to keep filled as they need. No individual plastic containers will be allowed. Keep your water container filled.

Games: Management of the entertainment for the evening. Following our speakers, we will be joining in hand game, Indian dice and maybe some other forms of entertainment. This group will be in charge of setting up, hosting and getting people involved.

You will be allowed to divide your group and select different groups (i.e., husband might choose fire and wife might choose food) or keep your group together (i.e., a parent and children might want to pick one group and stay together). You will make your selection in the registration forms below.

Everyone must be pre-registered by September 15, *no on-site registrations*.

Come early and allow plenty of time for orientation.

Group Orientation
Safety Orientation

Each traveler will be assigned to a group. Each group will have an assigned responsibility, just as we did when we lived in bands and clans. Group leaders will meet with each group and give a layout of their responsibilities for the two day journey.

Everyone who is able bodied will walk to our campsite. It is approximately a 3 mile cross country walk.

You will have to carry or in some way traverse your personal belongings. A check list is provided for suggested items.

Everyone must participate in safety training provided at orientation.

If you have medical needs, such as Insulin that must be kept refrigerated, you need to check in with our medical team and they will assist you with any needs you might have.

Saturday, October 23 10:00

Vehicles move to travel location

Vehicles will be allowed up to the Mullendore Ranch. Once you park, you must take everything with you that you need for the overnight stay. No one will be allowed back at their vehicles.

Second tier transport to starting location north of the Kansas border. Vehicles will be left at our final destination. We will be transported to our starting location for the walk.

Move to Camp – Our trail group will be in charge of lining everyone up for the walk to camp.

A long house will have been constructed ahead of time, wood and water will be on site as well.

Once we arrive at our camp site, a sack lunch will be provided.

Then each family will be assigned a camping location and begin setting up their campsite.

Cooks will need to begin dinner for the camp.

Historic Vignettes:

Along the trail there will be displays set up of historic events for your learning experience.

Dinner 5:00

Traditional dinner followed by clean up.

Evening Activities:

History – Historians will talk about our history at the time of the movement.

Story Telling – Story tellers are welcome to join in. Old Indian lore, stories by your ancestors.

Games: Indian Dice & Hand game

Sleep under the stars of your ancestors.

Sunday, October 24

Sunrise Prayer time for those interested. It is the belief of many that the breaking of dawn is the most spiritual and powerful moment of the day. A time when prayers are most powerful.

Breakfast The cooks will prepare a simple breakfast for all travelers.

Break Camp The camp must be packed up and ready to move. We are guests this time on the ranch and we must leave everything as we found it. All belongings, including trash must be ferried out.

Depart Camp 11:00am

Walk out of the camp in the same style we walked into camp to the ranch house for a wonderful catered meal by the Mullendore family. Their gift to you.

**WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT
FOR
Osage Nation Cultural Walk**

1. In consideration for receiving permission to participate in the Osage Nation Cultural Walk, I hereby RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE AND COVENANT NOT TO SUE, Osage Nation, their officers, agents, servants, or employees (hereinafter referred to as RELEASEES) from any and all liability, claims, demands, actions and causes of action whatsoever arising out of or related to any loss, damage, or injury, including death, that may be sustained by me, or any of the property belonging to me, WHETHER CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEES, or otherwise, while participating in such activity, or while in, on or upon the premises where the activity is being conducted.
2. I am fully aware of the unusual risks involved and hazards connected with this activity, including but not limited to travel risks. I hereby elect to voluntarily participate in said activity with full knowledge that said activity may be hazardous to me and my property. I VOLUNTARILY ASSUME FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANY RISKS OF LOSS, PROPERTY DAMAGE OR PERSONAL INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, that may be sustained by me, or any loss or damage of property owned by me, as a result of being engaged in such activity, WHETHER CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF RELEASEES OR OTHERWISE.
3. I further hereby AGREE TO INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS the RELEASEES from any loss, liability, damage or costs, including court costs and attorney fees, that they may incur due to my participation in said activity, WHETHER CAUSED BY NEGLIGENCE OF RELEASEES or otherwise.
4. It is my express intent that this Waiver of Liability and Hold Harmless Agreement shall bind the members of my family and spouse, if I am alive, and my heirs, assigns and personal representative, if I am deceased, and shall be deemed as a RELEASE, WAIVER, DISCHARGE AND COVENANT NOT TO SUE the above-named RELEASEES. I hereby further agree that this Waiver of Liability and Hold Harmless Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the Osage Nation.
5. IN SIGNING THIS RELEASE, I ACKNOWLEDGE AND REPRESENT THAT I have read the foregoing Waiver of Liability and Hold Harmless Agreement, understand it and sign it voluntarily as my own free act and deed; no oral representations, statements, or inducements, apart from the foregoing written agreement, have been made; I am at least eighteen (18) years of age and fully competent; and I execute this Release for full, adequate and complete consideration fully intending to be bound by same.
